- Applicants are required to appear in the entrance test conducted by Institute of Science and Technology, Tribhuvan University (IOST-TU) and should secure at least 35% marks in order to be eligible.
- The candidate must have completed 10+2 or equivalent examinations with Minimum 'C' grade in all subjects of grade 11 and 12 by taking Physics and Mathematics of 100 marks.

(Note: Both Biology and Mathematics group of students of +2 level are eligible to apply for the course)

Eligibility for Admission

Applicants are required to appear in the CMAT entrance test conducted by Faculty of Management, Tribhuvan University (FOM-TU) and should secure at least 40% marks in order to be eligible.

Curriculum Structure

The MBS program will have four semesters with 60 credit hours. Each semester shall have duration of 6 months. All the subjects carries 3 credits each. This program comprises of the following major three key components :

- Specialization Courses
- Dissertation
